Keywords are colorized and displayed in various colors depending on how many occurrences of the keyword have been found in the log. Keywords can be saved as a macro, just like ordinary mIRC commands. You may use the Keywords, "Text", and "Comment" commands in normal mIRC, but they will be ignored. Keywords and the "Text" command are useful when editing the log (mIRC's keyboard shortcuts can be enabled by default, they are also the same as mIRC's normal keyboard shortcuts). A real problem with keyword highlighting is not letting some keywords be enabled when you save as macro. You can make the keywords disabled or enabled by setting the "mIRCGlobalMacroEnable" variable. Keywords can be saved as a macro with the "SaveAs" command or manually edited. In the manual editing mode, you can directly edit the macro with a text editor. You may also save keyword macros as a file and reload them. Most of the basic formatting features are also available for keywords. Keyword macros are also supported for reading IRC logs with the "ReadIRC" command. mIRCLogReader has a simple to use syntax which will be described here. Syntax: The mIRCLogReader syntax is that of mIRC's "Script" language. mIRC's "Script" language syntax and mIRCScript.jar file are available at (See for more info) Script keywords are case insensitive. All mIRC commands are supported. Examples: mIRC LogReader can be used in three ways: · as a stand alone program · as an automatic log file reader · as an automatic log file reader with keywords If you are using the latter two options, you will need to add mIRC's "Script" and "mIRCScript.jar" files to your project's classpath. When using mIRCLogReader as a stand alone program, you will need to start it with the "mIRCLogReader" command. In a Windows OS, the file mIRCLogReader.bat can be copied to your startup folder. mIRCLogReader is free software, released under the GNU GPL. ----- mIRC LogReader is a small utility written in C++ to view mIRC logs. It can filter logs by channel, user, server, date, or keyword. The ability to highlight keywords and dates of interest makes the LogReader a valuable tool for IRC logs. Logs can be viewed in tabbed view, or the output can be saved as a txt, html, or png file. Logs can be viewed for many log types, such as normal, bot, error, action, and whisper. Also included is a calendar view to organize logs by date. A detailed settings dialog allows many options to be tuned. Use LogReader to display, sort, and organize your mIRC logs with a tool like no other. I know there is a good script out there, but I am looking for a program that, from within mIRC, will display an image when a trigger word is entered in the chat window. The trigger word, in this case, is "halo". Whenever a halo appears in the chat window, an image of a head wearing the same-colored halo appears. There should be no lag time between the trigger word being entered and the appearance of the image. Then a similar program can be made, but instead of showing the trigger word, it will show the number of people who are online, in case you want to see who is online when the halo image comes on. That should be easy to do with a script that will execute when a keyword is entered in the chat window, or when a custom message is typed. Hi, I am wondering if anyone knows a program that can run alongside mIRC and search for a certain word. I would like to use it to keep my screen free of the actual IRC chat, but still, if the word is typed I want to be able to see it. For instance, there are times I would like to look for a specific phrase, but don't want to have to physically leave the chat window. I would like to be able to type the phrase and have a program search all of the IRC channels and tell me who said it and what channel it was said in. I would also like to be able to save the data so I can see it at a later time. If this is impossible, I will just have to deal with typing each and every word that pops into my head.
